

**GREENFEILD PUBLIC RECREATION DISTRICT
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
FOR APRIL 14TH, 2025**

CALL TO ORDER:

ROLL CALL: David Kong (Chair), Beatriz Diaz (Clerk), Raul Rodriguez, Clara Valdivia, James Thorp

- ✓ All board members were in attendance and replied “here” in correspondence to their name being called with roll call when prompted.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Members of the public will be afforded the opportunity to make comments about items **not on the agenda**. Public comment is allotted as **3 minutes** per individual when the board opens public comment. “The board will normally not respond to public comments.” If an item is on the agenda, **please save your comments until public comment for the item is presented.**

1. Public comments (3 minutes please):

- ✓ Estabon Vargas – The last meeting the Lions Hall was discussed briefly. He questioned the board on when the Lions Club would be able to discuss getting the building operational again.
- ✓ Michael Bloom – Also representing the Lions Club. Brought up the utility situation at the hall. Reiterated a point that the club was paying out of pocket for utility expenses: water, electricity, and waste management.
- ✓ **Board Member Jim Thorp responded per request:** The water has been turned over to the Greenfield Recreation District; PG&E has been a little bit more difficult. Stated it’d be up to the board that it’s not on the agenda – but suggested we reimburse the Lions Club members paying out of pocket. Also stated there is meant to be a meeting with Chris Lopez.
- ✓ **Board Member Raul Rodriguez suggested the subcommittee work with Lions Club on this issue.**

2. Approval of Minutes for March 17th 2025

Motion will be reflect in April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion: Board member James “Jim” Thorp made a motion to approve the minutes from the March 17th, meeting. Board member Clara Validivia seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously carried by all board members stating “I” when prompted.

3. GREENFIELD PUBLIC REC DISTRICT PARK PROJECTS AND UPDATES:

- A. The oral report will be presented by Janet Thorp and Anival Mireles will make additional comments.
- B. The board will comment and or ask any questions on report.
- C. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.
- D. The board will finalize their comments and questions.
- ✓ The website as of this morning had a total of 836 clicks.
- ✓ The original register/roster Janet created for the Oak Park was originally created for weekends, until she was informed it was for weekdays as well. She went ahead and printed for all week days/redesigned for more extensive records.
- ✓ Janet informed the board she got \$50.00 out for the gate for change for the weekend. The process is however that a check needs to be written and that amount is to appear in the till when turned in at the end of the season.
- ✓ Security cameras are down at the park. Through this process Jim and Janet have been helping the Arroyo Seco Wireless team with access points. Anival and Daniel have helped as well with the cleaning of said access points.
- ✓ Greenfield Public Recreation District needed a new phone line as well for reservations. The phone is used as a dual phone for the Cemetery District as well. It’s displayed on our Greenfield Public Recreation District website as well as down at the Oak Park for people to contact. It’s an account under the Greenfield Public Recreation District.
- ✓ Janed removed Hector Gutierrez’s number/sign from the fence at the park as it’s posed confusion with the public.

- ✓ Recently she learned it was on the city site and emailed Ann Rathbun to get this process changed/started.
- ✓ Microsoft has posed an issue for me lately with storage/memory on the District(s) laptop. For the memory issue she bought a usb port, but also proposed that an updated version of Microsoft for Word/Excel so storage doesn't pose any further issues/this one is outdated.
- ✓ Designed a basic logo with the digital online software website named Canva. Informed the board that they'd need to purchase the logo/design in its various form(s). Also stated the price was \$1.99. Also informed the board canva has potential for future advertising purposes through subscription.
- ✓ A receipt was designed for the BBQ pits at the park but it was easy to replicate so the possibility of purchasing a receipt book was pitched to the board along with pricing.
- ✓ Informed the board Anival has been mainly taken the reserves at the park, but she assisted in a couple that were submitted via the website – when the original manager became ill.
- ✓ A couple questions have come up – there is a board approval slot on the reservation sheet. It was her understanding when someone reserves a pit if it's not already reserved that they in fact get the date/slot without further approval. Stated that the park is purely cash based at the moment. Also stated nowhere in the rules was there a cancellation policy. Informed people had paid with checks in the past and after speaking with David it did pose some issues. There was an instance from someone from Sacramento where someone wanted to pay by check and Anival and myself let her know we'd need to take that matter to the board, but she also confirmed she'd have someone come in and pay in person.
- ✓ Brought up an occupancy number for the big pits, whether someone needed to bring their own tables. Anival confirmed it would be the cement tables. Janelle – a member of the community is who is being referenced who rented the big pit area for May 24th, 2025, also wanted to know about the alcohol policy. Brought up other parks request/require security if alcohol is going to be provided for a certain number of individuals in attendance.
 - Clara stated that we do allow alcohol. Brought up the issue of glass bottles along with David.
 - She also posed the question if the issue was bottles was fighting. Also stated when volunteering she had an issue with someone with bottles.
 - The board confirmed no bottles were allowed.
 - Janet prompted confirmation what the occupancy number: good on occupancy, good on tables, and alcohol is find.
 - Raul asked if Janet could find an occupancy maximum for the park. Suggested it'd be good to know what are limit is.
 - David stated: There wasn't limits.
- ✓ Bea brought up bbq pits if they have a big pits. Jim stated that private pits were not allowed previous. Brian asked we ask the insurance about that. David stated that there could be issues with that.
- ✓ Also Janelle prompted about old park equipment being for sale and interested in purchasing.
- ✓ Thanked Anival and Daniel for the team work.
- ✓ Anival did not have anything to update.
- ✓ Jim added to the report: Lost the pipeline going to the park to the cemetery. The Rec district supplies the water to the cemetery. Anival added it's about 50 – 55 feet. Jim thinks it should all be plumped together in reference to later agenda item with the tank.

4. GREENFIELD PUBLIC RECREATION BUSINESS ITEMS:

- The board will here from the Greenfield Recreation Department on their proposal for the 2025 swim year.
 - A. The item will be presented by the Greenfield Recreation Department (Jesus Perez/Galilea Silva); the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ Jesus Perez: Good Evening Board members I'm Jesus Perez from the Greenfield Recreation Department. I have presented one page in regards to what the Greenfield Recreation Department would have to offer if given the opportunity to run the pool for this year. Stated the following:
 - Exploring the possibility of overseeing aquatics at the Oak Park Pool for summer and early fall.

- Group has over 8 years of experience in running youth educational sports, arts, adult and senior fitness programs, as well as other city events. They see this as the perfect opportunity to grow and expand their services for the community.
- Acknowledge lack of experience in pool management/operations but trusts the ability of the team to properly hire and train staff for the services. Together we could help provide aquatic services to the residents with the proper training, time, and opportunity.
- Aim to offer general swim lessons with the assistance of non-profits and recreational swim. Also later stated would want to offer adult swim. Wants to focus on these essential programs that the city could benefit from.
- Due to time constraints and current staffing cannot commit to the following: private pool parties, concessions, pool rentals, or aquatic aerobics. Additionally have not established any contracts with school districts to provide pool parties or lessons to students as well.
- If given the opportunity they'll focus on the following: creating pool programming with the district, present the MOU for approval of the board, get city council to approve MOU with this district, under his department's supervision. Restates they want to offer free swim lessons – through a non-profit, rec swim throughout the summer and early fall, and also requested an opening date for the pool after passing all health department inspections. If all of that goes suggests a date of early June.
- David prompted about what could be offer.
- Jesus responded what was stated on the paper as well as staffing of lifeguards for their safety. General swim lessons for kids and adults. Adult swim is also something that would be designated time wise for adults.
- Jim stated we wouldn't be able to provide a concession stand and suggested taking baby steps.
- David suggested a private vendor.
- Jesus suggested fundraising.
- Brian – Asked when the city council meets. Jesus stated they'd need it way before then. He needs to know its crunch time. City council needs to approve it and internally need to get the agenda ready. They could approve it subject to opening date.
- Raul wanted to know when we decide when to select. Brian suggested you'd need to put it on the agenda. Also said they could both manage it. Raul suggested that if we do move forward that Jesus provide a more detailed proposal. Suggested May 5th for a special meeting.
- Clara asked if they hired the staff if they would pay for it. Jesus stated: They would manage the programming, collect fees, and hire the staff/pay staff. The MOU would offset those costs and they'd share the cash report.
- Jim stated that the Soledad Mission Recreation District's proposal is a little aggressive. Being the way things are going with issues currently at the pool he's wary if we signed an MOU with them and they might not be able to fulfill what they want to accomplish for the first year of operation after being closed for five years.

B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.

- ✓ **Stephanie Garcia** stated that she was really glad that the rumor going around several years ago about some board members wanting to fill in the pool and not operate it anymore isn't true. She's glad it's being operated. When she first moved here it was open. Asked if it was going to be heated which she got a yes.

- ✓ Board responses to Stephanie: David said it was thanks to Jim. Jim stated he does not want the accolades. Clara stated that it was too much money and there was no money. The board said why go through the hassle so they were going to fill it in with dirt. David stated that it was due to insurance and it was quite expensive. David stated the city was going to put in an aquatic park.
- ✓ **Rosa Perez:** She wanted to vouch for Jesus he's done amazing work at the Recreation Center, and that the board should consider his proposal keeping it local. Allow the community see what is to be offered. Great for the kids. Proposed some sort of transportation because the ride out there could be quite dangerous. The community needs more events for the kids.
- ✓ David suggested Jesus put it into his proposal possible and he said he'd take it into consideration.
- ✓ **Jessica Bautista:** Appreciates Jesus stepping up because she suggested the city has deep pockets. She also suggested the board consider taking out the tennis courts and expand the pool because it's too small for our community. One could be a kid pool and one could be for adult swim. She thinks it could be beneficial.
- ✓ Jim brought up a future master plan for the park in response to this and informed the board that he's been in talks with grant writers.
- ✓ Stephanie suggested getting the bond could potentially be adjusted because she's not sure it's been adjusted since the Oak Park has been established.
- ✓ Jessica Bautista would love to be a part of a committee if that's something she'd be interested in doing.

C. The board will finalize their comments and questions and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: *No motion was necessary.*

• The Greenfield High School Sober Grad Committee is looking to discuss the possibility of the 2025 Sober Grad event at the park. Greenfield Fire Department and Greenfield Police Department will also be in attendance to discuss logistics

A. The item will be presented by the Sober Grad Committee, Police Department, and the Fire Department.

- ✓ Stephanie Garcia introduced herself as president of the Bruin sober grad committee established last year. The members in attendance are officers to oversee class events and tax money. As each class comes in they turn it over to them to establish their theme, fundraising, and own their classes event(s). Introduced President Rosa Perez, Jessica Bautista, and Greenfield Officer (SRO) Mister Giles, and captain Ozel (Fire Department).
- ✓ Rosa is president of the 2025 class of sober grad. The 2025 class graduated from 8th grade did a drive thru graduation. The desire is to give a really good last night/graduation for them. They are trying to think outside the box and want to host sober grad out at the park. It would be June 6th, 7:00PM – 12:00 AM or 8:00 PM – 1:00 AM. Stated there are 259 seniors. They get around of interest for attending. 150 seniors are interested in attending. There are 35 parent volunteers. They have the police department and fire department that will opt to do the logistics.
- ✓ Mister Giles the Greenfield Police Department has been supporting sober grad for the last five years or so. Their plan is to continue to do so and the way that would look. Maybe 2 officers would be there with help of the Fire Department. Stated there has been no issues at sober grad since they've been supporting it. Understand it's under county jurisdiction and there will be no conflicts of interest there. If anything happens regarding their students they'll handle it (GPD) and anything not related to the event would be the sheriff's office would handle it.

- ✓ Jim asked what they're proposing: They would provide lighting, a barrier, stated the area would go from the restroom, stage, the picnic area, and the volleyball court (closing it off).
- ✓ Clara asked: What they're going to be doing in terms of food and serving?
- ✓ They stated they'd be doing hamburgers, hot dogs, and snacks. They'd be looking for an electrician to hang up lights out there. They are looking to have a mechanical bull, a lounge area, a 360 photographer, a DJ, and a Mexican Banda (live).
- ✓ Jessica states they decorate with limited funds, but they really pull through. They would do glow up activities and glow up the park. The student union is small and would love a larger space. The Oak Park holds so many memories for kids growing up. They believe that having a graduation sendoff would be so meaningful. This is the first class to think outside the box. Hopes that the board would consider doing this and the support of the GPD and Fire Department. Invited the board. They are a non-profit and asked the board to read between the lines on what they're asking for.
- ✓ Raul asked when they wanted a response. Asked how late the Broccoli festival went did. Responses eased his concern.
- ✓ Jessica responded tonight!
- ✓ Jim stated very late – someone also said 11-12 and Rachel Ortiz stated that it ran all night long with a carnival.
- ✓ The board stated they would need to provide portable restrooms. Jim stated they're not very nice and we haven't tested them yet. Raul Sanchez stated they were not in bad state.
- ✓ Sober grad originated based on law enforcement so seniors would not go drink after graduation. It provides a safe environment and they wouldn't leave until parents pick them up.

B. The board will make comments and ask questions.

- ✓ Estabon Vargas remembers his sober grad. Suggests it's a good opportunity for these kids `Covid. Give them the opportunity to give them something different.

C. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.

- ✓ Bea thanked the committee for providing this opportunity to the graduates and that it was great.

D. The board will finalize their comments and questions and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: Yes – One motion was made.

Motion: Board member Jim Thorp made a motion to allow the Bruin Sober Grad committee to have the sober grad even down at the Oak Park. Board member Clara Validivia seconded the motion. The motion was carried by all board members when prompted.

- The board will discuss updates on the grant and basketball project – the progress, the report, and the bids being made by contractors for the project.

A. The item will be presented by James Thorp and Janet Thorp; the board will make comments and ask questions.

- ✓ Board member Jim Thorp let the board know that two bids were received. Another gentleman was interested, but would have to get registered with the state and that wasn't something he was prepared to do.
- ✓ Jim let the board know the state would not let him deal with him until David gives them permission in order to move thing forward. Suggest Granite would be the one to go with. States they're putting in a six inch slab and a bigger rebar.
- ✓ Raul asked what would be the reasoning.
- ✓ Jim stated due to it being a river bottom with fluctuations of land.

- ✓ The board stated the demolition being done previous to the work being done for the basketball court process.
 - ✓ \$124,000.00 would be the quote overall for the basketball court and the bathroom which may or may not be on the grant. It was not on the grant.
 - ✓ Grant total is \$177,000.00.
 - ✓ Janet sent the board both the quotes for review.
 - ✓ Alfredo's concrete's bid was \$80,000.00 – four inch thickness with number three rebar.
 - ✓ The state is going to have to approve it and Jim thinks if we're going to get it done we need to move on it.
- B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.
 - ✓ Estabon Vargas asked how much the grant was again, and then prompted to ask what would happen if the money is not all used? Suggested possibly using remainder for the restrooms if that was of the board's interest.
- C. The board will finalize their comments and questions and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: Yes – Two motions were made.

Motion: Board member Clara Validiva made a motion to award Jim the authority to work with the state. Board member Beatriz Diaz seconded the motion. The board unanimously carried the motion when prompted.

Motion: Board member Jim Thorp made a motion to accept a contract with Granite construction pending the update of their bid. Board member Raul Rodriguez seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously when prompted.
- The board will discuss the Oak Park Pool and any updates pertaining to the 2025 pool season. Including but not limited to perspective proposals.
 - A. The item will be presented by James Thorp and Janet Thorp; the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ Pool is full of water according to Jim. The relining and the skimmers are up to code. The city supplied the water and Cody Bassetti's wine tankers to haul the water. It's easier to balance the chemicals with city water rather than the well water.
 - ✓ David asked if we're going to have to do that every time they need water.
 - ✓ Jim stated it was a onetime thing.
 - ✓ The pump is rebuilt and it's holding water.
 - ✓ Cosmetics are still necessary to the office, bathrooms, and shower area.
 - ✓ We do still need the health department back down there for an inspection/a walk through before we can open. Just inspected construction part of it.
 - ✓ We may need new fences, need an automatic date, and a list of things we need.
 - ✓ Greenfield Recreation Department shared an album from Gonzalez Pool taking pictures and Janet made an item list based on things the Oak Park Pool may need.
 - B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.
 - ✓ Estabon Vargas applauds the board for getting the pool open again.
 - C. The board will finalize their comments and questions and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: No motion was made.
- The board will discuss the 3,000 gallon water tank, piping, and trenching, so that if the pumps go out at the Oak Park we have a water reserve.
 - A. The item will be presented by James Thorp and David Kong; the board will make comments and ask questions.

- ✓ Board member Jim stated that the tank should be plumbed at the same time the line is replaced going up to the cemetery.
- B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.
 - ✓ Estabon asked how old the piping would be. Jim responded with 65 years old; probably.
- C. The board will finalize their comments and questions and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.
 - ✓ The irrigation system should be a part of the new plan. Also stated the pool plumbing was redone pre-covid or during the time covid happened.

Motion Adopted: Yes a motion was made.

Motion: Board member Raul Rodriguez made a motion to allow a purchase of 60 to 80 feet of PVC pipe for this project. Board member Beatriz Diaz seconded the motion. The board when prompted unanimously adopted this motion.

- The board will discuss the hours of operation when it comes to the Greenfield Oak Park; pertaining to which days the park will be opened and which days they will be closed.

- A. The oral report will be presented by Janet Thorp; and the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ The season opened on April 1st, 2025 and has been open primarily on weekends since previous manager Hector Guitierrez got sick. There's been confusion between staff, board members, and the public. The hours need to be established at the park and online. Also let the board know Anival is off on Wednesday's and that's something that should be taken into account.
 - ✓ Board member Clara prompted Raul about something he had to stay about this topic and he responded as follows: Raul states that Anival working at both places right now. The board would need to direct him on what his hours would be and when he's working where. The two weeks leading up to Easter have been hectic. Now, after Easter. What kind of schedule should be given? Suggested that three and three should be considered. Suggested eight hours for six days.
 - ✓ Jim suggested staggering the employee's days off.
 - ✓ Raul stated that it'd work better if they take the day off together.
 - ✓ The park would be closed one day a week.
 - ✓ Who would open the park Monday and Tuesday if they're working at the cemetery?
 - ✓ They would open the gate – and work on the cemetery.
 - ✓ Raul suggested leaving it up to Anival because it's up to manager's discretion.
 - ✓ David suggested a part-time-temporary employee.
 - ✓ Jim stated that Jesus would come in and open the park on Hector's day off.
 - ✓ The question was also be if Daniel should work by himself.
 - ✓ Anival would give Daniel direction in accordance to this response. He is in fact already doing this in terms of direction.
 - ✓ Brian: Theoretically the general manager would be making these decisions.
 - ✓ The board would need to figure out how much the park would be open.
 - ✓ This is the advantage of having someone living there. If the manager could not relocate we could have an employee living there as an advantage.
 - ✓ The board discussed the possibility of closing two days or one day splitting. Raul recommended closing two days.
 - ✓ Hours are 9 to 5 on weekdays and 9 to 7 on weekends.
 - ✓ The board said the park would be closed Tuesday and Wednesday's. The boys are to figure the schedule out to their discretion.

B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.

C. The board will finalize their comments and question and if a motion is made to be adopted it will be recorded as stated in the April 14th, 2025 minutes.

Motion Adopted: Yes

Motion: Board member Raul Rodriguez made a motion to move the park hours of 9 AM to 5 PM on the week days and 9 AM to 7 PM on the weekends. Beatriz Diaz seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously carried when prompted.

- The board will discuss the up and coming holiday weekend (Easter) our busiest day of the season; restrooms and potential portable restrooms.
 - A. The oral report will be presented by James Thorp and Janet Thorp; and the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ Board member Jim Thorp suggested that it'd be prudent to have portable bathrooms during the Easter weekend. Suggested four to be prepared.
 - ✓ All the BBQ pits are reserved.
 - ✓ Jim suggested that since work alternative was lost that we get a labor contractor in there to get the park into shape for the holiday.
 - ✓ Raul brought up the old benches and we needed those rebuilt. Lumber was put away so it was not ruined. Suggested the benches get redone before the weekend.
 - ✓ Work alternative is a necessity according to board member Jim Thorp.
 - B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual
 - ✓ Estabon stated the cement tables at the stage are the biggest issue.
 - C. The board will finalize their comments and question and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: Yes a motion was made.

Motion by: Board member Clara Validivia made a motion that the board hires a labor contractor to clean up the park before the Easter weekend. Board member Raul Rodriguez seconded the motion.

Raul excused himself from the meeting at this point.

- The board will discuss the end of the year school trips and any potential fees (bus fees) upon entrance to the park.
 - A. The oral report will be presented by Beatriz Diaz; and the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ The school brings about 100 kids out to the park for the end of the year program. On May 22nd, they'll go out there.
 - ✓ Jim Thorp prompted about letting them in free of charge. The board said they do that and continue to do that.
 - B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual
 - ✓ Estabon says he works that day. The sixth graders go out there and get acclimated with one another as the next year they'll be in middle school together.
 - C. The board will finalize their comments and question and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: No motion was made.

- The board will discuss the possibility of getting dumpsters at the Greenfield Oak Park. Two for the summer and one for the winter season.
 - A. The item will be presented James Thorp; the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ Board member Jim said that he thinks we should have dumpsters down there rather than running vehicles to the dumpster every Monday. Waste management would dump on Monday. The park has a slab poured specifically for dumpsters.
 - B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.
 - C. The board will finalize their comments and question and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: Yes a motion was made.

Motion: Board member Clara made a motion to bring back dumpsters to the Greenfield Oak Park. Board member Beatriz Diaz seconded the motion and it was unanimously carried when prompted.

- The board will discuss the ticket booth for the 2025 season and will hire a potential applicant or further employment and running of the booth.
 - A. The item will be presented Beatriz Diaz; the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ The ticket booth is only for Saturday's or Sunday's. The position was not advertised and one applicant turned in an application. Janet stated it'd be considered an emergency in this instance.
 - B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual.
 - C. The board will finalize their comments and question and if a motion needs to be adopted the motion and vote will be reflected in the April 14th, 2025 minutes as stated.

Motion Adopted: Yes a motion was made.

Motion by: Board member Clara Validiva made a motion to hire applicant Hortencia Valenzuela to work at the ticket booth for \$17.00 an hour paid bi-weekly. Board member Jim Thorp seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously carried when prompted by three board members due to it being Bea's sister she could not vote.

- The board will discuss job applicants for the management position advertised in the Salinas Valley Tribune and the website, and any other prospective details; possible closing dates, interviews, or re-running the ad.
 - A. The oral report will be presented by Janet Thorp; and the board will make comments and ask questions.
 - ✓ Janet informed the board the advertisement ran in the paper for a two week period and is currently on the website.
 - B. The board will turn the floor over to any public comment(s); one comment/response per individual
